The Public Hearing for the Proposed 2022 Sewer User Rate and Connection Fee was held on November 23, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. with Mr. Coronato presiding over the meeting. Attached is a copy of the computerized transcript of the proposed 2022 sewer user rate and connection fee taken on November 23, 2021, by Colleen M. Vaughn, Certified Court Reporter. A motion was made by Mr. Montenegro and seconded by Mrs. Clement to adopt the connection fee for the Authority for fiscal year 2022 of \$2,874. A roll call vote was taken with Mr. Montenegro, Mrs. Clement, Mr. Brilliant, Mr. Siddiqui and Mr. Valvano all casting affirmative votes. Another motion was made by Mrs. Clement and seconded by Mr. Montenegro to adopt the sewer rate and user charges for fiscal year 2022, including the basic sewer rate \$337.16 and the rate schedule that has been presented here today. A roll call vote was taken with Mrs. Clement, Mr. Montenegro, Mr. Brilliant, Mr. Siddiqui and Mr. Valvano all casting affirmative votes. Mr. Coronato stated to the Chairman that this concluded the public hearing on both the basic sewer rate and user fee, as well as the connection fee. The public hearing concluded at 4:21 p.m. A short recess took place before going into the regularly scheduled meeting agenda at 4:30 p.m.

Meeting #1248 was called to order at 4:30 p.m., November 23, 2021 by Chairman Valvano.

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Ms. Diamante, Assistant Secretary, reported that in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law, P. L. 1975, c. 231, notice of this meeting was posted on the Township Bulletin Board, the Authority Bulletin Board, filed with the Clerk's Office and published in the Asbury Park Press.

Ms. Diamante called the roll. Dr. Manforti, Mr. Bilotta, Mr. Brilliant, Mr. Montenegro, Mrs. Clement, Mr. Siddiqui and Mr. Valvano were present.

12	take the whole debt service plus capital expenditures
13	made by the Authority through 12/31/20 less grant
14	funds, donated sewer lines, easements, laterals and
15	the sale of the Ortley Beach plant, all this as of
16	12/31/20. You divide that number by the number of
17	EDUs to obtain connection fees.
18	Equivalent dwelling units are
19	calculated by dividing the OCUA flows for 2020 by 73
20	gallons per day times 365 days is used to estimate
21	daily flows. This calculates the EDUs.
22	2022 projected calculation connection
23	fee calculates to 2874.42, and we have rounded that
24	to 2,874, as you cannot charge more than but you can
25	charge less than.
